- RESULTS-'Where's the Food' Community Survey

The 'Where's the Food' community survey was made available both online and in hard-copy throughout the month of December 2010. The hard copies were available at a few locations within Fitzroy Harbour, and were also distributed via committee and community members. An article introducing the survey appeared in local newspapers/newsletters. Forty-four (44) persons responded to the survey online, plus 23 persons responded to a hard copy of the survey for a total of 67 respondents. There are approximately 400 households in Fitzroy Harbour, but as can be seen in Question 11 below some respondents were from outside the area, and some did not indicate in which postal code area they live. As such it is difficult to determine the exact response rate for Fitzroy Harbour.

Community Garden

1. If a community garden was started in Fitzroy Harbour, how likely is it that you/your family would participate in it?

- 32% (20/63) responded Very unlikely
- 21% (13/63) responded Unlikely
- 21%(13/63) responded Undecided
- 17% (11/63) responded Likely
- 10% (6/63) responded Very likely

Comments:

- "We have enough space on our property for our own garden.".
- "My husband owns his own farm".
- "We have our own garden, but it would be nice to be able to make a small profit (money making exercise for kids) off of the excess we don't use".
- "Don't live right in village so it hard to tell".
- "We already have a big garden".
- "We've moved 10 kilometers out of Fitzroy, so I'm undecided".
- "We have already our own very large garden".
- "We have a large garden on our property".
- "We are on a farm".
- "We already have four raised beds in which we grow vegetables and herbs".
- "What a great idea!".
- "We have our own garden".
- "I have my own garden".
- "Prices would have to be better than grocery store, financial concerns".
- "If there are any opportunities please email suzanne.taylor@live.ca".
- "What does participate mean? Hard to commit to this you don't know time?? As a committed volunteer - help "garden". Gardeners - some time??"

Good Food Box

2. How likely is it that you/your family would participate in the Good Food Box program if it came to Fitzroy Harbour?

- 17% (11/64) responded Very unlikely
- 19% (12/64) responded Unlikely
- 28% (18/64) responded Undecided
- 25% (16/64) responded Likely
- 11% (7/64) responded Very likely

Comments:

- "Most of my food is grown on the farm".
- "Would like to see our own residents i.e. Harvest Moon, be a supplier vs a farm from Ottawa South and pesticide free!"
- "It would depend on what items were available and the cost. Presently we are able to use pick your own fruit farms and have most of our own vegetables".

- "I would like to see how this would unfold with regards to how it could best suit my families needs".
- "Supporting local growers and producers is a very important part of a healthy community for sure!"
- "At the moment we can drive to the farmers markets, grocery stores, etc."
- "I run one at work for Kanata but could move it".
- "What a great idea".

- 4. How likely is it that you would participate in a Meals on Wheels <u>frozen meal</u> program?
 - 44% (27/61) responded Very unlikely
 - 26% (16/61) responded Unlikely
 - 7% (4/61) responded **Undecided**
 - 8% (5/61) responded Likely
 - 5% (3/61) responded Very likely
 - 10% (6/61) responded **Does not apply**

- 5. If a weekly shuttle service to a grocery store was offered to residents of Fitzroy Harbour, how likely is it that you would use it?
 - 53% (34/64) responded Very unlikely
 - 23% (15/64) responded Unlikely
 - 5% (3/64) responded **Undecided**
 - 13% (8/64) responded Likely
 - 6% (4/64) responded Very likely

Comments:

- "I am not a senior".
- "When we are much older perhaps".
- "Maybe in the future as we age".
- "We usually purchase groceries in Arnprior, where we go on a regular basis".
- "Not at this time".

- "I work in town and the store is close to my work".
- "Able to drive myself".
- "As able, based on time commitment".

Country Kitchen

6. How likely is it that you/your family would participate in a Country Kitchen program?

- 33% (21/63) responded Very unlikely
- 16% (10/63) responded Unlikely
- 17% (11/63) responded Undecided
- 24% (15/63) responded Likely
- 6% (4/63) responded Very likely
- 3% (2/63) responded Already participating in Country Kitchen

Comments:

- "Time, time, time...where to find the time?"
- "I would volunteer to help with such a program".
- [I work with the] "Dunrobin Community Center it is possible to open up to this effort".
- "Very occasionally".

School program -for parents only

7. Would your family be interested in having a daily breakfast program at your child's school?

- 34% (16/47) responded **Yes**
- 66% (31/47) responded **No**

- "St. Michaels Fitzroy Harbour".

- "My child will be starting at St. Michael's in Fitzroy in September 2011".

- "My children are no longer in grade school but should there be a need at the local primary school(s), I strongly support the initiative".
