



URBAN AGRICULTURE NOW PERMITTED IN OTTAWA!



The Zoning By-law has been changed to allow **market gardening** in almost all zones in urban areas of the city.



Under the new rules, fruits, vegetables, herbs and flowers grown in market gardens, residential yards and many other locations may be sold, donated or shared, if soils are safe for food production and the permission of property owners is obtained.*

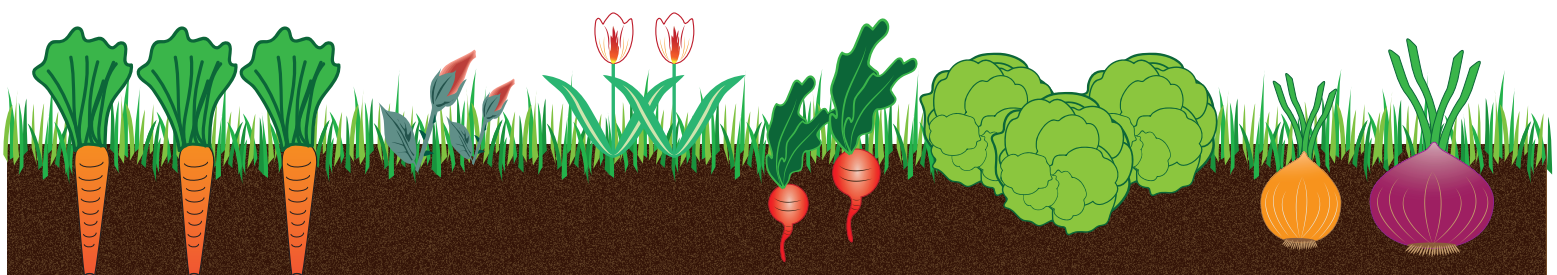
